About us

Near East University (NEU) Faculty of Nursing started its four-year undergraduate and graduate education in the 2007-2008 academic year as NEU Faculty of Health Sciences, Department of Nursing. Since 2008, Doctorate education in Nursing has started. Since 2018, education and training have continued as the Faculty of Nursing. Our faculty has become a large faculty serving over 1300 students with its Turkish and English Program.

Near East University, which has an international identity with its educational opportunities and strong teaching staff, has a deep-rooted educational tradition. It has been a centre of education, science and culture since 1988. Near East University operates in an international and multicultural identity with its world-class education and infrastructure facilities as well as its competent teaching staff. Standing out with its identity as the most important science and culture centre of the Mediterranean, Near East University has adopted the principle of raising its students as self-confident, rational, creative, innovative, researcher and free-thinking individuals who hold their responsibility above all else.

With this vision, Near East University; achieves significant success at the international level. In the Times Higher Education (THE) World University Rankings in 2025; Being in the 601-800 band, it maintained its title of "the best university in the TRNC" and strengthened its place among the top five universities in Turkey and among the top three among foundation universities. In the "Best Global Universities 2024–2025" list of the US-based US News & World Report, Near East University ranks 689th worldwide, 7th in Turkey and 1st in the TRNC.


According to the results of THE's 2025 Impact Rankings, our university ranked 43rd in the world for its work towards the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, 35th in the "Partnerships for the Goals" category, 48th in "Health and Well-being", 13th in "Quality Education", 15th in "Sustainable Cities and Societies", and 57th in "Gender Equality". Physical Sciences 200-250, Computer Science 250-300, Engineering and Education 300-400, Social Sciences 500-600, Life Sciences 600-800, Medicine, and Health 800-1000, and shared the title of "best Turkish university" in Turkey and TRNC, especially in the fields of Physics and Computer Science.

With its performance in teaching, research, and international outlook, including THE Young University Rankings 2024, the university has also gained a strong place among young universities.

The 2024 ranking results revealed the young, dynamic, and research-oriented structure of Near East University at the international level. In the "Young University Rankings 2024" published by Times Higher Education (THE), our university ranked 139th among universities under the age of 50 globally and was among the prominent institutions among young universities.

Our university has also achieved a significant success in the 2024 Field-Based Academic Ranking published by Shanghai Ranking. Near East University, which is among the top 400 universities in the world in the field of physics, has been shown among the best universities in Turkey in this field, together with Boğaziçi University and Bilkent University. In the field of mathematics, it is in the 401-500 band and is in the top three in Turkey. These degrees reflect Near East University's strong research infrastructure in the field of basic sciences, qualified academic staff and globally accepted publication performance.

Degree Awarded

Students who successfully complete the program are awarded a Bachelor of Science in Nursing.

Program Admission Requirements

Within the framework of the regulations set by the Turkish Higher Education Council (YÖDAK), admission to this

undergraduate program is carried out by the university as follows:

For international students:

- High school diploma (Admission is based on high school credentials)
- Proof of English language proficiency

For Turkish Cypriot students:

- Admission is based on the Near East University Entrance and Placement Exam
- Proof of English language proficiency

Graduation Requirements and Regulations

The language of instruction is Turkish, and the duration of education is 4 years. To graduate, students must have a Weighted GPA of at least 2.00/4.00 and complete all program courses with a minimum grade of DD/S. The minimum ECTS credits required for graduation is 240.

Recognition and Evaluation of Prior Learning

Full-time students at Near East University can be exempted from some courses within the framework of the relevant regulations. If the content of the course previously taken in another higher education institution is equivalent to the course given at NEU, the student may be exempted from this course with the approval of the relevant faculty/institute after the course content is evaluated.

Program Information

The aim of the Near East University Faculty of Nursing undergraduate education program; To train nurses who have gained scientific understanding and competence, who can integrate their knowledge and professional skills, who have sufficient knowledge, skills, and attitudes to provide comprehensive, qualified and contemporary nursing services in national and international health institutions, and who have the awareness of protecting, developing and improving public health.

Program Outcomes

- 1. Define the physical, psychological, spiritual, and sociocultural characteristics of the individual.
- 2. Knows the structure, functions, and relationship of the human body at micro and macro level.
- 3. Can use scientific knowledge about basic medical, scientific, social and behavioural sciences.
- 4. Can perform nursing care with a holistic approach in cases of protection and development of the health of the individual, family and society and deviation from health.
- 5. Can use interpersonal communication skills in nursing practice.
- 6. Can use it by following the innovations in information and technology for individual and professional development.
- 7. Can use English to access and contribute to the international nursing literature.
- 8. Able to conduct scientific research to advance nursing knowledge and address current issues in the field.

- 9. Can use learning and teaching time in nursing practices.
- 10. Performs nursing practices in line with legal and ethical principles.
- 11. Determine the patient's nursing care needs and special situations.
- 12. Can use the cognitive and psychomotor skills necessary for nursing practice.
- 13. Can use critical, creative thinking and problem-solving skills in nursing practice.
- 14. Can use information about management activities involved in the planning, organization, execution, evaluation, and coordination of nursing services.
- 15. Can show responsibility for lifelong learning.
- 16. Can cooperate and lead with the individual, family and health team in nursing practices.

Titles to be Received by Graduates of the Faculty of Nursing

Graduates of the Faculty of Nursing will receive the title of nurse.

Program Structure

The nursing undergraduate program consists of a total of 240 ECTS credits with 45 compulsory, 18 elective courses. There are at least 4 courses in each semester, excluding common compulsory courses and elective courses. The program includes common compulsory courses determined by the Higher Education Planning, Evaluation Accreditation and Coordination Council (YÖDAK) and other common courses determined by the University Senate. Each semester, elective courses can be taken from other faculties other than the elective courses of the faculty.

Exam Guidelines, Assessment and Grading

As a result of the evaluation made by the academic staff teaching the course for each course taken at NEU, students are given one of the letter grades explained below. There is an ECTS weight for each letter grade.

The table below provides information about letter grades, weights and ECTS equivalence:

In order to be considered successful in any course, students must have at least DD in 5th level (associate) and 6th level (undergraduate) programs, at least CC in 7th level (master's) programs and 8th level (doctorate) programs must also get at least CB. For courses that are not included in the GPA, students must get an S (Satisfactory) grade.

In addition to these, each local letter grade also has an ECTS grade. In this way, mobility between institutions is supported.

The table above is used for all courses within NEU. Apart from these letter grades, the following letter grades are also recorded in the student course transcripts:

The grade I (Incomplete) is given to students who fail to fulfil the requirements of the course by the deadline of the relevant semester for a valid reason acceptable to the academic staff teaching the course. Students who receive an I grade will be able to submit all missing grades no later than one week after the deadline for submitting the course grades of the relevant semester.

obligations. However, in some exceptional cases, this period is two weeks from the start date of the next semester with the decision of the relevant academic unit manager and the board of directors.

It can be extended to before. Students who do not fulfil their obligations on the given date will automatically change their I grades to FF or U.

The grade of S (Satisfactory) is given to students who are successful in non-credit courses.

U (Unsatisfactory) grade is given to students who fail non-credit courses.

P (Successful Progress) grade is given to students who are not included in the GPA and whose obligations exceed one semester and who can show the expected performance in the relevant semester.

NP (Not Successful Progress) grade is not included in the GPA and the obligations are a

It is given to students who cannot show the expected performance in the relevant semester in courses exceeding the semester. EX (Exempt) grade is given to students who are exempt from the relevant course in the program.

NI (Not included) grade is given for the performance of the students in the courses they have taken but are not included in their GPA. These grades are stated in the student's transcript, but are not included in the courses taken within the framework of the program they are enrolled in.

A grade of W (Withdrawal) is given upon the recommendation of the student's academic advisor and the permission of the academic staff who issued the course, if the student withdraws from the course after the add/drop date in the relevant semester and up to 10 weeks after the start of the semester. The student cannot withdraw from any course

in the first two semesters of the program. In addition, those who have received a W grade in any course before and whose grade is not included in the average

Students cannot withdraw from the same courses again. Students studying in associate degree programs can withdraw from a maximum of two courses, and students studying in undergraduate programs can withdraw from a maximum of four courses. The student must retake this course in the first semester of the course from which the course is offered.

NA (Never Attended) grade is given to students who do not fulfil the attendance requirements for the specified course and lose the right to participate in the evaluations to be held at the end of the semester. NA grade is not included in the average calculation.

Letter grades corresponding to both national and ECTS loads are shown in student transcripts.

Graduation Requirements

To graduate from this undergraduate program, students must fulfill the following requirements:

- To be successful in all courses in the curriculum of the program by getting at least 240 ECTS and at least DD/S grades.
- To have a Weighted Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 2.00 out of 4.00.

Registration and Admission Procedures

Student Affairs locate in the Communication Faculty building and is open Monday-Friday from 08:00 to 17:00. Students can get information about faculties from student affairs, register, and provide documents such as exam entry documents, student certificates, and transcripts.

Registering for Courses

Registration for courses is done online every semester. After making their semester fee payments, students can take their courses from the online registration system http://ogrsis.neu.edu.tr. Each student receives a student ID and password from the faculty secretariat to access the site. After students choose their courses online through the system, they must be approved by their advisors through the system. The relevant registration process is also available on the university's website. However, students whose tuition fees are not paid and who do not submit their receipts to the Student Affairs Office cannot make active transactions in the online system. The registration process is completed by the department's advisors.

In addition, course registrations are also carried out together with advisors in the relevant departments. Students can meet with their advisors within the date ranges specified in the academic calendar, get information about their courses and choose courses.

Add/Drop and Course Withdrawal

Course Add/Drop and Course Withdrawal days are determined for each semester and announced in the academic calendar. During this period, students have the opportunity to attend the courses they are enrolled in and change their courses by adding or dropping them if they wish. Withdrawal/course change/course addition is limited to the period specified in the academic calendar. Students can meet with their advisors and perform the transaction they request.

Horizontal-Vertical Transfer

Students who want to transfer by horizontal and vertical transfer must apply to the Student Affairs Office. After the student's application is approved, he/she must bring his/her transcript from the university he/she came from to the department he/she was accepted to. Before starting the student's education, it is examined by the Department Head/Dean and the appointed advisor whether the courses taken at the previous university are considered equivalent to the courses in this department. Students' Participation in the Course and Excuses

Students must attend at least 70% of the course hours for each course. Medical reports obtained from the Near East Hospital or state hospital are considered valid for the excuse of absence. If a student cannot take any exam, he/she must bring his/her report within 3 working days following the exam date; Otherwise, the student loses the right to take the make-up exam. Students are required to follow the make-up exam schedule on the university's announcements page or the instructor's personal page. If a student misses the pre-announced excuse exam date, he/she loses his/her right to take the exam.

Student Affairs

The Student Affairs Registrar's Office and Student Accounting Units are responsible for keeping the records of students regarding their student processes from the first registration to graduation, informing them about the payment processes, guiding the students within the framework of the relevant regulations and managing the student documentation processes.

Registration acceptance procedures (pre-registration, final registration, course registration, etc.), student document procedures (student certificate, transcript, etc.), transfer procedures, immigration procedures, military service postponement, deregistration/dismissal, academic leave procedures, student ID card application, student petition acceptance, TRNC-YÖKAS transactions (higher education registration system), student information system update

procedures, student affairs official correspondence, student announcements and graduation procedures (Graduation Certificate / Diploma / Graduate Transcript Document, etc.) are carried out.

Our Student Affairs Accounting unit; student tuition investment transactions (tuition fee, social activity, internship, stamp, transcript fees, etc.), payment method options (cash or instalments), determination of student status (active, passive student, etc.), semester registration procedures, master's and doctoral course approval, midterm/final/make-up exam entry document approval and accounting petitions are evaluated.

Life on Campus

Library

Located right across the Faculty of Economics and Administrative Sciences building, the Grand Library has 1,000,000 open shelves and more than 150,000,000 electronic journals, 7000 DVDs, 17 movie viewing booths, 12 individual and group study rooms, 4 lecture halls for 1000 people, a theatre for 350 people, a cafeteria for 600 people and 600 desks. As such, it is a world-class cultural information-access centre. The Grand Library is open 24 hours a day and free of charge. Equipped with the latest digital technology, the Information centre can be accessed from anywhere via the internet. The desired information can be accessed via the wireless computer network on campus.

Social Activities and Clubs

During their education, students can also attend conferences organized by the school from time to time and engage in social interactions by participating in club activities. Some of the clubs operating within the school are Law Club, Nature and Sports Club, Scientific Research and Health Club, Theatre Club, Photography Club, Tango Club. It has interior equipment. With these features, it is the first and only Olympic Indoor Swimming Pool in the country. With its commissioning, swimming courses are organized in summer and winter. There are also sports nutrition and dietitian services, as well as special sections for children and women.

Campus Traffic Rules and Safety

The Near East University campus is subject to traffic rules determined for the safety and comfort of our students, employees and visitors. Traffic rules are inspected 24/7 by NEU personnel and penal action is taken when necessary.

A thorough understanding and implementation of these rules will contribute to creating a safer campus environment together.

Traffic Flow and Priority: Traffic flows from the left lane on the NEU campus. Therefore, vehicle drivers must use the left lane and follow the rules of giving way so that other drivers can proceed comfortably.

Pedestrian and Bicycle Priority Campus: Give priority to people walking or cycling at pedestrian crossings and bicycle paths. Reduce your speed and proceed carefully in these areas to provide a safe environment for pedestrians and cyclists.

Speed Limit: The maximum speed limit within the campus is 40 km/h. Adhering to this limit makes a significant contribution to preventing accidents and ensuring overall safety.

Horn and Loud Noise: Honking and listening to loud music are prohibited on campus. Following these rules helps you maintain the peace of mind of the people around you.

Traffic Signs and Road Indicators: Traffic signs and road indicators are placed at multiple points on campus to ensure a safe and orderly traffic flow. Complying with these signs is important to ensure a safe flow of traffic.
