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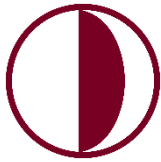
IN-BED BATH STUDENT EVALUATION FORM

Procedure Steps	Score Value	Score Obtained
1. Preparing the environment: Ensuring that necessary supplies are ready and clean, maintaining appropriate temperature and comfort	1	
2. Verifying the patient's identity and obtaining consent	1	
3. Locking the bed wheels and adjusting the bedrails to the appropriate position	1	
4. Ensuring privacy (closing the curtain, using appropriate drapes)	1.5	
5. Hand washing / hand hygiene	0.5	
6. Establish communication with the patient and provide information about the procedure.	1.5	
7. Wash the face and upper body (cleaning the eyes from the inner corner to the outer corner).	0.5	
8. Wash the armpits and upper extremities from proximal to distal.	1.5	
9. Wash the torso and abdominal area.	0.5	
10. Wash the back and lower back area.	0.5	
11. Wash the lower extremities from proximal to distal (legs and feet)	1.5	
12. Clean the perineal and genital areas, using the correct anatomical terms (with a focus on privacy).	2	
13. Ensure the bed is properly made and the patient is in a safe position.	0.5	
14. Collecting used materials and cleaning the environment.	0.5	
15. Performing the steps using soapy water (except for eye hygiene), followed by rinsing and drying.	2	
16. Use both sides of the cleaning cloth used during the steps and replace it as it becomes soiled.	2	
17. Document the procedure.	2

• **Question Pool 1**

1. Name two factors that affect personal hygiene.
